

The Global Citizenship Programme (GCP) was established to develop a strong academic community and scholarly programme at Ustinov College. It supports our thriving postgraduate community, whilst providing students with intellectual and professional development and networking opportunities.

The GCP offers funding opportunities and leadership roles for Ustinov College students, who are able to advance their research through community engagement, and acquire a set of transferable skills for academic and non-academic fields.

Aims of the GCP

The purpose of Ustinov College's Global Citizenship Programme is to create an environment that facilitates all members of the Ustinov community to:

- critically reflect upon their position in the world and the legacies that shape it;
- rethink the past and imagine futures different to the present;
- take informed, responsible and ethical actions, and;
- expand their frames of reference for living and working together in an increasingly complex world.

Defining the global citizen

While the concept of global citizenship is not a new one, it is becoming ever more important in our expanding and increasingly complex world. While our national identities are assigned to us at birth, a global citizenship takes time to develop.

Global citizenship is not something that is artificially created and imposed at Ustinov College. We already celebrate the rich, diverse and different cultures in our community and through looking at local identity and its relationship nationally and globally. Global citizenship at Ustinov arises from dialogue and debate, by creating space for voices from across diverse fields, cultures and personal perspectives to be heard.

We offer a range of ways for members to explore and think critically about complex issues in today's world, and to use insights and experiences to drive practical initiatives in local and global settings. We are all buffeted by political and economic forces - but that is no reason why you shouldn't be active in shaping the world you want.

Intellectual community, professional skills

Durham is a research-intensive university. The GCP complements and communicates that research. As part of the GCP team, you will formulate ideas and themes for interdisciplinary seminars and conferences, and learn how to communicate your research to a wider audience. You will develop and enhance networking skills as well as presentation technique. You will be working as part of a focussed and effective team which also further develops interpersonal and team work qualities.

GCP Structure

Imagine organising seminars and activities, leading community initiatives, networking with leading academics, and on top of all that, receiving support towards your living costs!

The GCP offers a number of opportunities. The team comprises five scholars who will work together as part of a multi-disciplinary team to create and deliver seminars and activities under our five core projects :

- Cafe des Arts
- Cafe Scientifique
- Cafe Politique
- Ustinov Intercultural Forum
- North East Local History Project

There is an expectation that there will be a minimum of one event under each theme delivered each term.

There are a further two positions for scholars who will focus on organising and delivering volunteering activities in College. The minimum expectation would be two volunteering events to be delivered each term.

As a core group of seven, the team will also deliver the Ustinov Annual Conference (held in June) and will offer support with the Ustinov Art Exhibition (typically held in the summer each year).

Each GCP scholar will receive a £3000 scholarship for their contribution to the GCP across the full academic year.

Editorial and photographic scholarships

One £4000 scholarship is available for the position of Editor of The Ustinovian and Pantomath. The Ustinovian is the College Magazine and is published three times every year. Pantomath is the College's scholarly journal and is published once a year, in the summer.

One £1000 scholarship is available for a GCP photographer who will be expected to attend GCP events and ensure good quality photography is available for College promotional purposes as well as contribution to The Ustinovian.

Additional information

Scholars are not required to live in College accommodation but it is encouraged. If scholars live in College accommodation, their scholarship will be paid against their College accommodation fee unless otherwise requested.







Café Scientifique

Café Scientifique was set up to bring science and technology out of the lab and into the café. Participants don't come just for a public lecture, but to take part in a public conversation. The typical format involves presentations around a particular theme, followed by a Q&A session and refreshments. Your brief to communicate scientific issues to a nonspecialist audience puts you in contact with speakers from the University's science departments as well as leading science communicators.



Events range from seminars to visits to local sites of interest.


Hear from Reece:

It has worked well alongside my Master's studies and has offered opportunities for events and discussions directly related to my field of study.'



Café Politique

Café Politique is the premier politics discussion forum in Durham outside the School of Government and International Affairs (SGIA). Starting in 2007, Café Politique has provided a focus for debate and discussion on the topics of the day - from area studies, international relations and security, elections, global finance, to the politics of football. Café Politique has successfully held its events out of college and around campus which has attracted a wide following of students. Ustinov Seminar & Annual Conference

The Ustinov Seminars provide opportunities for external speakers to deliver talks on topical themes, as well as providing an interdisciplinary forum for postgraduate students across the university who meet to share their research and friendship. The Ustinov PG Research Seminars typically include three or four 20-minute presentations from a range of disciplines, grouped around a common theme to prompt discussion. Students come along to rehearse potential conference papers, practice presentation skills in a relaxed and friendly environment, or simply enjoy introducing their research and ideas to students from various disciplines.

Seminars featuring invited speakers are also held each term, are open to the wider University and the general public, and cover a wide range of interesting themes.

The Ustinov Annual Conference was set up in 2015 as an interactive and engaging space for dialogue between students, academics and practitioners to explore questions of global citizenship at the intersection of academic theory and real life practice.

It provides the student organisers with a great opportunity to gain transferable skills in event management and team building, as well as to develop interdisciplinary academic thinking. For conference participants, Ustinov College offers an ideal environment in which to discuss current academic trends and questions of global significance.

Ustinov Annual Conference critically assesses key issues in global citizenship.

Media and Publications

If you enjoy writing, social media, photography, graphic design, filming and editing, the GCP invites you to bring your skills and ideas to College life.

The GCP offers one Editorial position which would make you responsible for both of the key College publications, The Ustinovian, and Pantomath. This is a key role within the team and requires a proactive, well organised and creative approach. The post attracts a scholarship of £4000 for the full year and requires three editions of The Ustinovian and one edition of Pantomath to be designed, created and published on time and to a high quality. This role works closely with members of the College team, as well as an external publishing company who support with design elements of the process.

The GCP also offers one Photographer position. In this role, you will be responsible for GCP photographic content. This will involve you photographing GCP and College activities and events and ensuring that effective imagery is then provided for use in College social media, as well as College publications. A creative and flexible approach is vital for this role as is a commitment to be maintain a presence at as many GCP or College events as is reasonably possible.



As noted above, the College has two key publications:

The Ustinovian reports on College life and news and is distributed to a wide audience including current students, staff and alumni. The Ustinovian is produced termly and the Editor is involved in the design, editing, and production of the magazine, as well as the collation of material. There is an expectation that the Editor will recruit a small team of volunteers to assist, as well as working closely with the GCP Photographer in terms of photographic imagery.

The Pantomath is a relatively new venture which features a wide range of scholarly articles by current and former Ustinovians from all academic disciplines. The Pantomath demonstrates the breadth and depth of research activity undertaken in our community.



We would like to enable stories, memories, events and topical themes to be explored, discussed and enjoyed by the widest audience. This may include collaborating with partners within Durham University and externally, with local regional partners or the wider community. Activities and events may include seminars, regional trips, external speakers, discussion groups and museum excursions, with a specific focus on enhancing our existing relationship between College and the wider local community.

This is a relatively new addition to the GCP, and is an exciting opportunity; we welcome input and creative suggestions as to how the team will approach the 2023-24 academic year.

- Coal and Cloths; The Miners' Legacy




Hear from Maddy:






The Global Citizenship Programme and Scholarships are open to all current postgraduate full-time members of Ustinov College, from any subject or discipline.

The application process for the Global Citizenship Programme and Scholarships opens in early June and closes 31st July 2023. Decisions are communicated in mid August.

Applications are accepted throughout the year for non-funded (voluntary) positions in the Global Citizenship Programme.



Eligibility Criteria

To take up a scholarship, you must have been accepted onto a full-time programme of postgraduate study at Durham University and be a member of Ustinov College. Your registration status must have reached Final Acceptance (FA) stage. If you have any queries over your registration status in relation to your GCP application, please email ustinov.gcp@durham.ac.uk

Positions and awards are open each academic year to Ustinov College members, from any subject or discipline, including taught and research students.

Students in receipt of a full studentship, such as a Research Council studentship or Durham Doctoral Fellowship, or substantial funding from another source to the approximate value of a full studentship can be considered, but preference may be given to students who are without full funding.

Existing award holders are welcome to re-apply for a position/award for the next academic year.

Opportunities for volunteers

Students are welcome to take part as GCP volunteers which is a lesser commitment but provides valuable opportunities to contribute to the GCP.

In addition, Ustinov College GCP Awards Committee may use its discretion to appoint only a portion of the awards in the summer round, and reopen the application process later in the year to invite further applications from GCP volunteers and new students.
