and is one of the largest sections of the University. In total at any one time there are approximately 1800 students taking courses in the School, around 700 of them studying for the BA in Modern Languages.

The School is located in Elvet Riverside, a group of modern university buildings situated on the bank of the River Wear between the ancient Elvet Bridge and the new Kingsgate footbridge, and within easy walking distance of the Colleges, the Cathedral and the Market Place. Most lectures, classes and tutorials take place in Elvet Riverside, which also houses a self-access and study area.

Our Centre for Foreign Language Study has around 2,500 students coming from all University departments taking credit-bearing modules or study Language for All classes (usually available in the evening for a payment of a supplementary subsidised course fee).

All the language departments in the School have their own student societies, which arrange excursions, invite speakers, produce plays, show films, hold parties and run other social events. There are also many college and university clubs and societies catering for all kinds of interests. Durham itself is a small cathedral city, and Newcastle-upon-Tyne with the shopping centres, cinemas, theatres, clubs and other facilities of a large urban centre is less than twenty minutes away by train.

B: DEGREE STRUCTURE

The School of Modern Languages and Cultures offers the following Honours degree:

BA Honours in Modern Languages and Cultures
BA Honours in Visual Arts and Film

The School also participates in the following degrees:

BA Honours in a Modern European Language and History

All degrees at Durham have a modular structure, consisting of six modules each year for three years. Modules are usually studied over all three terms of the teaching year. All modules are examined or assessed in the year in which they are taught: this means that at the end of the first year there are preliminary examinations, and that the final degree class is determined by the examinations taken in the second and third year.

The Honours in Modern Languages and Cultures degree course lasts four years with the third year spent abroad. In each of their years in Durham, students take six modules. Some of these modules will be compulsory core language modules. Each module stretches over the whole academic year, and is examined by one or both of coursework and exams.

Choice of Modules

IMPORTANT NOTE FOR STUDENTS: PLEASE READ BEFORE COMPLETING YOUR LEARNING AGREEMENT

At Durham University European agreements are signed by individual university departments and are not university-wide agreements. This means that, in general, students will have to choose modules (courses) within the Durham University department through which the European agreement with their home university has been signed (students should check with the Exchange Coordinator in their university if they are not sure which department this is). Modules offered by other departments are subject to availability and can only be taken with prior consent from the relevant department. *Incoming students must take at least 50% of their modules in the host department and can take modules outside in no more than two additional departments.* Certain restrictions may also apply to courses in some departments and students need to follow the advice below carefully before completing their application form.

Please clearly indicate the modules you wish to take in the application form for approval by the respective department(s). Before completing your application form, it is very important that you read carefully the relevant departmental section(s) of the Module Handbook to check which modules are available to you and any restrictions which may apply. It is imperative that a properly completed application form is submitted. Only complete applications can be processed.

The Centre for Foreign Language Study (CFLS) elective language modules are taught over the full academic year from October to May. Incoming exchange students may register to a **maximum of two CFLS elective language modules**. Only one of these modules may be at Beginners level. Incoming exchange students arriving in October and leaving in December may only register for CFLS elective language modules by special arrangement and will then be awarded **5 ECTS credits**. Incoming exchange students arriving in January are not able to register for CFLS elective language modules.

The following modules are open to incoming exchange students under the above-mentioned conditions and subject to the module prerequisites, further information is available in the [Faculty Handbook](#). Please note that Stage 1 modules are not open to incoming students staying for only one term.

An informal evaluation test may be conducted by the module convenor on student's arrival to ensure that the student has selected to study a language at the correct level. Those modules are all worth 10 ECTS.

Students wishing to register for a language module with the Centre for Foreign Language Study will be required to complete and submit a Language Declaration form to check suitability and eligibility for a language module at the requested level. Registrations cannot therefore be confirmed until close to the start of the teaching year once we receive the language declaration form.

D2: Modules available to students coming on an external link (through a different department)

It may be possible for incoming exchange students coming through other Departmental or School exchange agreements to study modules either offered by the School of Modern Languages & Cultures (MLAC - see section D) or the CFLS. However, the students should contact the relevant departmental Exchange Co-ordinator to obtain permission to study the module(s) they are interested in.
