






2022/23 cycle



2022/23 cycle: return to stability?


- What does post-Covid look like?
- Grading changing again
 - "Protection for students" what did this mean in practice?
 - Not uniform changes to grading across countries within UK
 - Accuracy of predicted grades?
- Conversion uncertainty
 - What would our competitors do?
 - How would applicants behave?





2022/23 cycle: return to stability?

- Would there be major changes in-cycle?
- Managing recruitment within hard caps on capacity
- Instability in postgraduate recruitment
- An unstable world: war, conflict, geopolitics, economic challenges, cost of living





2022/23 cycle: what it wasn't


- It was not easier to manage and predict
- It was not stable
- It was not taking away places for home students to give to international students





2022/23 cycle trends

- Total home applications modestly increased on previous year
- Significantly more home offers made in 2022/23 than in 2021/22







August Decision Making


- We accepted near misses
