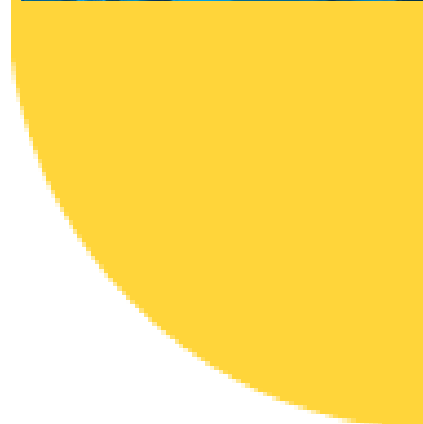

College Allocations

- The college allocation process is **separate** from the UCAS application process and is managed by different teams. Applicants do not **apply** to colleges.
- The college allocation process typically starts in May.
- A new allocation process is expected for 2027 entry. Offer-holders are able to submit some college preferences.
- Degree subjects are distributed across all colleges.
- College allocation is **preliminary** and will be confirmed following results day.

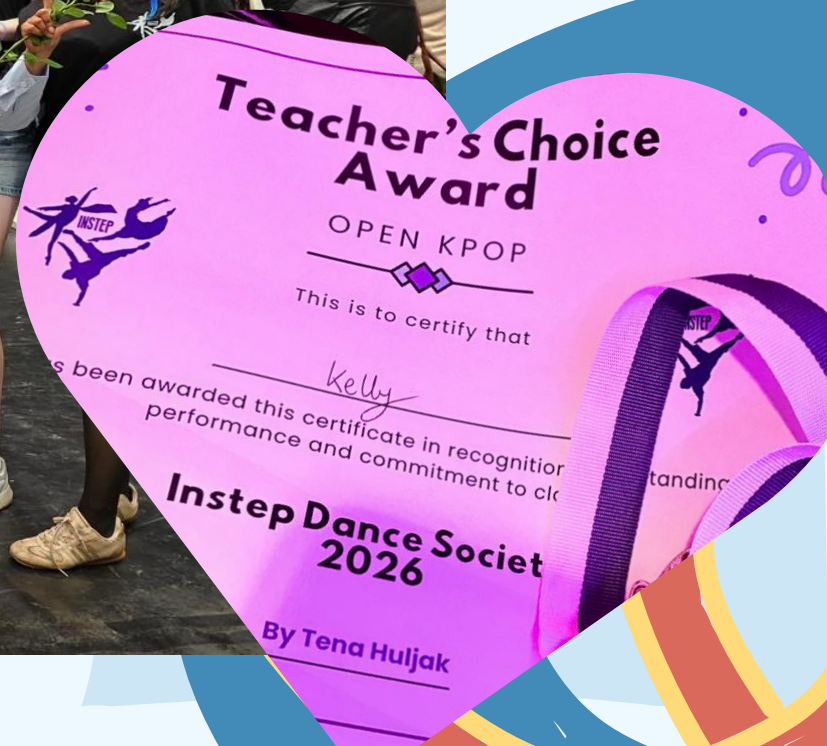
