BUCS sport continues to be a major focus for us here at the university; the 21-22 season saw a number of successes with both men's and women's rugby winning their respective national leagues, men's fencing, men's lacrosse, men's and women's volleyball, women's cricket and men's indoor cricket all winning the BUCS Championship, and our women's hockey 3s winning the BUCS Trophy. The boat club also topped the table for the first time in years across all BUCS events. The rise of Futsal last season showed considerable promise for the future of futsal here at Durham, after a close promotion. Going into this season, we are looking to emulate these great results and if possible look to improve, although the competition keeps getting tougher! We are currently sitting second in the BUCS points table going into Christmas, with our 125 BUCS teams competing week in week out to climb their leagues.
